Hope to see you all in July!





2019 Library Report

2019 was a busy year for the WCGS Library. We were open 10-3 Tuesdays and until 7 on the third Tuesday, and 10-2 on the third Saturday of each month. We were staffed by library committee members and other great volunteers.

201 visitors signed in at the library. There may have been <u>more or some</u> who didn't sign in. We also had several email, phone, and mail requests for help. Visitors and requests for research were from <u>Walworth County and</u> several <u>other</u> Wisconsin locations as well as other states.

79 donated and purchased 79 items were added to our collection.

Donations included the Silver Books donated to our library by the Wisconsin Mayflower Society and the 1907 Atlas of Walworth County. We also received collections from families of current and former members which we are sorting and filing in family binders.

<u>The highlight of the year was on</u> April 16, <u>when</u> Dr. William Hopkins, Governor of Wisconsin Society of Mayflower Descendants, presented a 24-volume set of *Mayflower Families Through Five Generations "Silver Books*" to WCGS library. These volumes have been used many times to research Mayflower ancestors.".

Thank you so much to all the volunteers who <u>staffed the library and helped with projects _and</u> staffed the library through the year.

 \cdots Walworth Happenings – Will Potter has a fine new meat market and is doing a good business.---------Horse blankets, men's duck coats, canvas leggings and most all kinds of rubber footwear can be found at Jackson & Jackson Co's store at reasonable prices-----The frame of the passenger depot was raised last week and the large water tank is nearly completed.-----Will Coon, our tax collector, will have his office in Jackson's store this season.----Born, to Mrs. Walter McNally, a ten pound baby girl, Nov. 22, 1900.---------Joe Topping was down last Friday to set up a new coal stove for Frank Sutherland.-----Aden Kaye had the misfortune to get his hand into one of those savage corn huskers last Thursday, and will have to have it amputated.-----Chas. Tobiasson, one of Walworth's good carpenters, left Monday for a long trip across the ocean to Guttenburgh, Sweeden, to visit his parents and sister, whom he has not seen for nine years. He expects to return in the spring. -----(Shirley's note: All spellings are as printed in the newspaper). (The Delavan Enterprise, Thursday, Nov. 29, 1900)

<u>Geneva Lake</u> – Deputy Sheriff Durkee drew a revolver on a window curtain last Sunday night, about midnight, commanding it not to move an inch. He thought he had discovered a robber in his chamber.-----Rev. A. A. Hoskin, pastor of the M. E. Church, preached his farewell sermon last Sunday. He is in Milwaukee under treatment for his shattered health.-----Mr. Hicks, who has been for some time very sick, is now recovering.----Ioan Sloan, of Fort Scott, late of Geneva, is back again on a visit to his parents and--the boys, of course. He looks as though he had been working hard.-----Horatio Seymour died Tuesday, Sept. 24th, aged 43 years and Simon Gardner died on Friday last, aged 65 years. (The Delavan Enterprise, Oct. 3, 1878)

Fontana – Guy Baker is getting the foundation ready for a new house on South Water street.--------Little Jessie Deline, a boy 9 or 10 years old,

caught an 8 pound pickerel last week Monday. -----Mr. Schroeder, of Harvard, has exchanged homes with Mrs. Hawver and moved his family here on Saturday. He is a stone mason by trade. -----Cyrus Ward was a caller here Monday on his way to see his mother, who is working at Dewight Hatch's. She is just getting up from quite a hard attack of congestion of the lungs.------Quite a little interest is shown over the possibility of having a physician here in our midst. There is some talk of Dr. DeHund, of Waukesha, coming here to practice, but there is nothing definite as yet—he is undecided between Darien and here. (unknown paper from March 1898)

Comments from Shirley – My very first column was back in Jan.-Feb.- of 2005 called "Township Tidbits". I divided the county into four sections and each column was on a different section, such as the SE corner of the county. Then I soon realized that some places like Williams Bay and Allens Grove were not townships, so I changed the title to "Around the County Tidbits" in the May-June 2009 issue, so as to cover all locations. That's over 15 years of tidbits! I looked tidbit up in the dictionary and it said a tidbit is a very pleasing bit of news. (or food) This will be my last "new" column but there's an idea to maybe "recycle" some of my older columns from the past. Next year I'll be 90, notice the word "next"—I'm not there yet! So maybe I will be laughing at my recycled columns along with you all. It's been such fun reading old newspapers over the years and sharing tidbits from them. Some of the language they used and some items that we wouldn't even want to put in a newspaper nowadays gave us some good laughs. Others enjoyed finding a clipping about their ancestors. I tried to keep most clippings between 1880 and 1900 to cover that period of time when the 1890 census burned and it was so hard to find data on our ancestors or where they lived.
